We've put together essential recommendations to help you navigate the challenges of preparing for and rebounding from a hurricane. Follow these steps to safeguard your operations and recover swiftly.

Pre-Storm Preparation Checklist

- Check and secure all A/C panels and any mechanical equipment.
- If you are closing your premises in anticipation of a storm, make sure to shut off the main gas line
- Whenever feasible, clear all debris from your roofs.
- If feasible, protect your entrances and exits with sandbags and board up windows and doors.
- Don't forget to review your property insurance plan
- Make sure to store all crucial documents in a secure location
- Cut down food supplies to minimize waste and loss. Donate excess to local shelters or emergency facilities if evacuating, and track donations for tax benefits.
- Provide all employees with a written hurricane procedure. Maintain updated contact lists for vendors and staff.
- Use signage and social media to announce any closures or cancellations clearly.
- Ensure all company vehicles are fully fueled for potential evacuation. Advise employees to do the same with their personal vehicles.
- Take photos of your inventory, building structure, property, and equipment to support any potential insurance claims.
- Ensure your information technology systems are fully backed up and secure to protect against potential disruptions.

DURING THE STORM

- Monitor the weather closely, and if conditions worsen, promptly notify management about the need for closure.
- Stay vigilant for any fallen power lines to ensure safety.
- Instruct employees on methods to keep customers away from hazardous areas effectively.

AFTER THE STORM

- Inspect the premises for any damage. Immediately call 911 if you or an employee find downed power lines.
- Prepare detailed damage reports with photos, covering both water and structural damage, to support any necessary insurance claims.
- Make sure that food supplies meet local health code standards.
- Contact a professional mechanical contractor to verify that the equipment is functioning properly.
